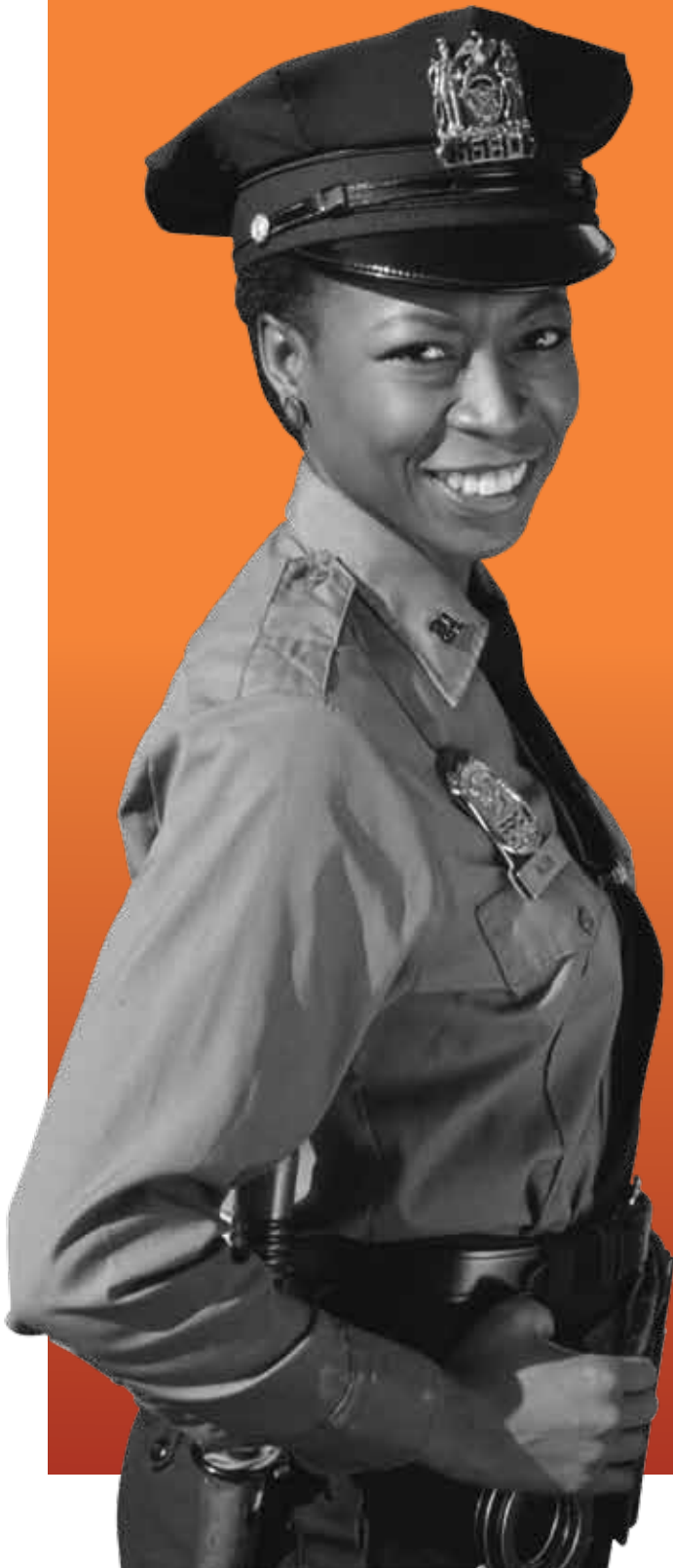

THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE FIELD NEEDS TALENTED PROFESSIONALS LIKE YOU

Public safety has become an important priority for society. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, long-term national job growth is expected for many sectors of the criminal justice field from 2008 through 2018.²

- New opportunities for private detectives and investigators are expected to result from increased litigation, heightened security concerns, and the increased need to protect confidential information and property.³
- Population growth is likely to contribute to the demand for police services.⁴
- Correctional officers may experience favorable job opportunities stemming from population growth and rising incarceration rates.⁵
- National long-term job growth for probation officers and correctional treatment specialists is expected to be 19 percent, faster than the average for all occupations, from 2008 through 2018.⁶

A bachelor's degree is often required for many of the positions noted,² and as the field becomes more competitive, employers may increasingly look for educated, qualified individuals.



PREPARE FOR A WIDE RANGE OF CAREERS WITH ONE DEGREE

The criminal justice industry boasts numerous career choices in a variety of public and private sector fields. An advanced start bachelor's degree from Kaplan University could help you pursue work in any of these environments:^{1, 2}

- Federal, state, and local government agencies and organizations
- Police departments (additional academy training usually required)
- Corrections (prisons and jails)
- Private detective agencies
- Department stores or general merchandise stores

DAY-TO-DAY ACTIVITIES WILL VARY BUT SOME OF THE TASKS THAT GRADUATES COULD PERFORM INCLUDE:¹

- **Law enforcement (police officers and detectives; additional academy training usually required)**—Pursue and apprehend individuals who break the law, and issue citations and warnings or make arrests; work to keep the peace and protect the public
- **Corrections officer**—Maintain security and inmate accountability to prevent disturbances, assaults, and escapes; enforce rules and regulations
- **State parks officer or highway officer**—Maintain order and respond to emergencies, protect people and property, enforce motor vehicle and criminal laws, and promote positive community relations
- **Private investigator or detective**—Assist individuals, businesses, and attorneys by finding and analyzing information
- **Probation officer**—Gather information about offenders' backgrounds by talking to offenders, their families and friends, and other people who have relevant information



A STRONG FOUNDATION STARTS WITH A SPECIALIZED EDUCATION

Kaplan University's criminal justice program is designed to offer a strong foundation of professional skills and criminal justice knowledge while allowing students to specialize in an area of interest. Students can choose from seven different areas of emphasis, including law enforcement, crime scene investigation, forensic psychology, corrections, and homeland security. A capstone project at the end of the program gives students the opportunity to apply their new knowledge and skills to real-world criminal justice scenarios. In addition, students could also qualify and arrange their own hands-on internship. This combination of education and experience could help graduates pursue employment or advancement in a wide range of criminal justice occupations.¹

The program focuses on the following knowledge and abilities:

- An overview of the U.S. criminal justice system, its agencies, and the issues and challenges facing the system
- In-depth knowledge of criminology theory, including causes of crime and discipline-specific evaluation of human behavior
- A broad understanding of criminal law, the types of criminal offenses, and the principles of criminal culpability
- How to apply principles of criminal law to criminal justice practice
- Analytical skills such as the ability to use scientific methods of inquiry to arrive at reasoned decisions
- Knowledge of criminal justice leadership practices, including the role of organizational culture, behavioral theory, planning, and community relations
- An understanding of how new technology is used in criminal investigation, criminal enterprise, and in the operations of criminal justice agencies
- Knowledge of transnational criminal enterprises and the role of culture in criminal behavior and justice systems
- A strong education in the applied research methods and techniques used in the field

Transfer Credit

We are committed to helping you save time and money as you earn your bachelor's degree. If you have an associate's degree, you could earn your bachelor's degree in as little as 2 years of full-time study. In addition, you may be eligible to receive college credit for prior coursework, formal training courses, or work and life experiences.⁷

Accelerated Master's Degree Option for Bachelor's Degree Students

Eligible students in this bachelor's degree program who want to continue on to pursue a master's degree within the School of Criminal Justice or School of Legal Studies may be interested in the accelerated master's degree option. Students complete graduate-level courses within this undergraduate plan of study. Once accepted to the master's degree program, students transfer in the graduate courses and matriculate into a shortened degree plan. This accelerated option allows students to complete both their bachelor's degree and master's degree in less time and at a lower cost than completing both programs separately.
