Kaplan University Graduate Education District Scholarship Program

Kaplan University has established a full scholarship program to assist teachers from select school districts who plan to enroll in Kaplan University’s Master of Science in Education (MSE) or Master of Science in Education in Instructional Technology (MSEIT) programs.

Award

Up to 15 scholarships covering full tuition at Kaplan University for the entire degree program will be granted provided recipients agree to the following Kaplan University activities after completing their first term in the program:

- Provide feedback to Kaplan University on their experience and make recommendations for changes/improvements.
- Submit three essays to Kaplan University on “My Kaplan Experience” or “How I have applied my Kaplan University education in the classroom.”
- If eligible, participate in Kaplan University’s Ambassadors Club

Application Information

Interested students must complete an application. Applicants will receive acknowledgment of receipt of their application. Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information.

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship Management Services postmarked no later than September 22.

Requirements

- Be a teacher currently employed by and teaching in one of the following school districts:
 - Collier County Public Schools, Naples, FL
 - Lake County Public Schools, Tampa, FL
 - Dorchester County Public Schools, Cambridge, MD
 - Frederick County Public Schools, Frederick, MD
 - Howard County Public School System, Elliot City, MD
 - Kent County Public Schools, Chestertown, MD
 - Parkway School District, St. Louis, MO
 - Pattonville School District, St. Louis, MO
- Must have a bachelor’s degree from a regionally or nationally accredited institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
- Must have a minimum undergraduate cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- Must plan to enroll in at least two courses per term in Kaplan University’s Master of Science in Education (MSE) or Master of Science in Education in Instructional Technology (MSEIT). (Enrollment must begin by December 7, 2011.)
- Must be continuously enrolled; withdrawing from school will result in ineligibility.
- Must maintain cumulative grade point average of 3.5 in the designated program.

Note: Current Kaplan University graduate students in one of the designated online programs are eligible to apply provided they are in good financial standing with Kaplan University. Any awards granted to current Kaplan University students will be made in the term subsequent to the application term.
